The Property Committee is always kept pretty busy with all kinds of jobs. Here's what we've been doing during the summer months:

- the outside windows of the minister's office were sanded and given two coats of paint.
- The bell tower was washed and all debris removed from the roof and around the roof drains.
- A new contract was signed with the Sidney preschool staring September 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019. Volunteers from Home Depot and the preschool arrived on Aug 15 and 16 to replace the slide, fix the sand box area and paint the shed. The event was very successful.

#### The Front Door Entrance **Progress**

By the time you read this newsletter you may have entered the church through the new doors! Can you believe it, on 24th September last year we had a meeting of the congregation to vote on the proposed new entrance, and now it is almost complete!

Work on the new front entrance has been proceeding very well throughout the month of August. Doors arrived around the Week of August 13. The doors and windows are now in and the drywall has been installed. Painting has been completed and the new floor was laid last week. During the week of September 4 the inside doors will be installed and the entrance will be available to be used by September 9.

# ST PAUL'S CHURCH COUNCIL NEWS

The Church Council met on August 29th after the summer break.

Under "New Business" we discussed the results of a Sound System upgrade review conducted by Pacific Audio Works over the summer months. This was done in response to requests for improved sound to the choir loft, and for hearing assistance options for Sunday services. The review was completed at no cost to St. Paul's and included current and future needs related to audio/ visual equipment.

The Church Council agreed to assess all priorities for church expenditures before proceeding with any or all of the recommended upgrades at this time.

In the short term we have asked for technical assistance to hook up our mobile speaker system to improve reception for the choir area. (We will still be able to use this in the fellowship hall for meetings). Minimal cost is involved.

Regarding hearing assistance, there are options available and Pacific Audio Works will loan equipment for a trial period, however we need to establish the needs of the congregation first:

- how many have hearing aids with t-coils built in for wireless "loop" connectivity
- and how many folk need listening devices like headphones or ear speakers.

We would be so grateful if you would help us in this research by indicating which of these would be of interest to you. There is a sign up sheet at the entrance of the church for this purpose.

Other news from the Church Council is that we are busy with the significant task of reviewing and updating the church's "Terms of Reference". This pertains to our organisation, structure and procedure and identifies how we do our mission. It may sound like a laborious piece of work but it is a vital document for our church community that explores the various groups at St Paul's and how we all work together under the same mission statement.

Our church, like any other, depends on the love, time and work of our volunteers. We would love to develop a great way of inviting folk to join in the work of the church by helping or serving on one of our committees or in another way. There will be a couple of vacancies opening up on our Church Council soon and we also want to develop our Outreach Committee. Later, this year, in our Stewardship programme, we will be showing you in detail, what your church does and how folk give their time and service. You will, undoubtedly find something that will be of interest to you and we hope you may respond to the invitation to serve, alongside many others in our ministry here.

Please do be prayerful about the life and work of St Paul's that we may respond, with grace to God's call to be the church in this place.



### **BURSARY FUNDS**

The **Doris Williamson Bursary Fund** was established in about 1989 by a member, who was also a trustee, Doris Williamson. A principle amount of \$10,000 was held in the bursary fund for post-secondary education. The interest was to be used to award bursaries to people of St. Paul's United Church or their family members.

Many bursaries have been awarded over the years since then. The maximum amount of \$500 per successful applicant is granted and applications are processed through the Board of Trustees.

This summer 2 bursaries were awarded to grandchildren of members of congregation, — both starting first year at Camosun College. There will be money available next fall to award at least one more bursary.
